DEAR CHALLENGE CLUB LEADERS

Challenge National Director

Julia Teresa Tallon was born in 1867 on a farm in the Mohawk Valley near the city of Utica, New York. She was the seventh of eight children born to Bridget and Peter Tallon, both of whom had emigrated to the United States from Ireland. They brought with them the deep faith of their homeland as a heritage for their children. When she was 19, Teresa joined the Holy Cross Sisters in South Bend, IN. For 33 years she remained with the Sisters teaching a variety of subjects in Catholic schools. All the while God was preparing her for her future work. In 1920, she founded a new congregation of nuns in New York City, dedicated to go door to door, person to person, to teach the faith and help people. The congregation of nuns was called the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate. Though Mary Teresa was quiet by nature, she was strongwilled and courageous, as well as intelligent. Most people, though, remember her for her eyes, very kind, warm with understanding, seemingly able to read the hearts of others. She worked with the nuns visiting people home to home, in prisons, and in hospitals. They helped teach the faith to adults and children, as well as offering special programs for teachers and parents to learn about God. During the last twenty years of her life, she was suffered great physical illness but continued to work. Many of the nuns did not even know that she was sick. In 1954, when she was almost 90 years old, Mary Teresa died after praying her rosary. Her cause for canonization began and she has been declared a servant of God in 2013. The order now has convents in the Bronx, Arizona, Nigeria and the Philippines.

ANSWERS TO A FEW QUESTIONS WE HAVE RECEIVED FROM CLUB LEADERS THIS MONTH

After loading up all the lunch sacks, we drove downtown where this ministry hands out the lunches to the homeless people in our community. This ministry takes place every week- rain or shine- so many of the homeless community know when and where to show up! It was a great experience for our club-- to not only help-- but to be the ones who deliver the food directly to these people. It gave us a chance to see the faces of the people we were serving. One time this winter, we even brought big igloo jugs filled with hot chocolate-- for a special
